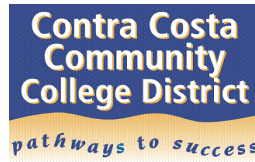

ADDENDUM NO. 2

Your attention is called to the fact that the following have changed:

BID NOTES:

1. The old scope of work on the “Construction Agreement” document does not pertain to this project. “Addition of a kitchenette in an existing classroom. Includes demolition, casework, sink, floor finishes, drywall, plumbing, electrical, paint, and doors/frames/hardware. See Specs.”
 - a. See revised construction agreement “scope of work”
 - b. The Work consists removal and replacement of the existing waterproofing membrane on the third floor balcony. The work will require crack repair on the balcony to ensure the coating is fully sealed and waterproofed.”

QUESTION AND ANSWERS:

1. In the NOTICE INVITING BIDS it says “The Work consists removal and replacement of the existing waterproofing membrane on the third floor balcony. The work will require crack repair on the balcony to ensure the coating is fully sealed and waterproofed.”
However, in the Contract (page 25) in Scope of Work it says “Addition of a kitchenette in an existing classroom. Includes demolition, casework, sink, floor finishes, drywall, plumbing, electrical, paint, and doors/frames/hardware. See Specs.” It’s 2 different scope of works. Which one is correct?
 - a. The first scope about the removal and replacement of the waterproofing membrane is the correct scope. The scope on page 25 in the contract is incorrect. Please disregard.
2. In the bid documents I didn’t find Bid Bond Form, can we use our own form?
 - a. The Usual AIA form is fine.

All other facts and specifications to this bid remain unchanged. **Be sure to acknowledge receipt of this addendum in the Bid Form.**
